CLASS OVERVIEW

Learn how to take beautiful photographs while cataloging some of Berrien County's important historic buildings and places. Your best photographs will be kept for future generations to enjoy in a special youth archive at the Berrien County History Center. You will also photograph artifacts discovered at the Old Jailhouse Archaeological Dig and the Tarragindi Archaeological Dig (see Tarragindi.org) and create a very important historic photographic record of the Spring 2026 Dig Season for Berrien County. We will also learn about some of the fascinating history and stories of Berrien Springs that will inform and inspire our photography.

This is your time to learn new techniques, be creative, try different angles and perspectives, learn from others, share ideas, and try to capture amazing and unique photos of Berrien Springs and its history. A parent, grandparent, or guardian over 18 is welcome to accompany you, but is not required. Friends and siblings aged 5-18 must be registered for this class with the parent partnership to participate, or be a fee-paying student.

Dr Jan Sigvartsen PhD (Dr Jan) has taught Archaeology and Ancient Religion classes at Andrews University, Michigan, and the Theologische Hochschule Friedensau, Germany, where he was also their PhD Programs Coordinator and Associate Director of their Institute of Biblical Studies and Archaeology. He has participated in archeological digs in the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordon and the United States. A lot of archaeology involves carefully photographing artifacts and building remains for posterity and historical records. Dr Jan has traveled to every continent, except Antarctica (it's on his bucket list), photographing historical sites, cultural sites, and the modern people who inhabit the areas in and around them. He exceeds the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualifications Standards for Archaeology, as stipulated in the Code of Federal Regulations, 36 CFR Part 61 (see: https://www.nps.gov/articles/sec-standards-prof-quals.htm.

Leanne Sigvartsen (Ms Leanne) originally trained as a psychologist in Australia and spent many years as a counselor and academic advisor for teens and young adults. She then transitioned to research project management, working on a number of projects, most recently as the Research and Special Projects Director at the Chicago-based *Center for Collaborative Study of Trauma, Health Equity, and Neurobiology.* She is a triple citizen of the United States, Australia, and Malta, and has lived in the United States, Australia, and Germany. She wants to see young people succeed, be happy, and grow into thriving adults - especially those who have experienced trauma and adverse childhood experiences. She has a passion for photographing castles, cathedrals, and cottages — not just to capture their beauty, but also the historic and fascinating lives of the people who lived in them.
